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1. Introduction

Are you considering studying in the Netherlands? You are very welcome! Before you immigrate to the Netherlands, there is a chance that you will need to make some preparations. For example, a visa or residence permit. We therefore advise you to start your preparations early so that Codarts can advise and support you where necessary. To help you on your way, we have prepared a step-by-step- plan.

2. Before coming to the Netherlands

STEP 1. Immigration procedures

To enter the Netherlands and take up temporary residence, you will need to complete the correct immigration formalities. What the immigration authorities require depends on what nationality you have, the purpose of your stay and how long you're staying in the Netherlands for.

STEP 3. Place to live

Rotterdam is becoming more and more popular and there is a big shortage in housing for both students and local residents. Therefore, we strongly recommend you to find a place to live as soon as possible to avoid stress and disappointment. Make sure to start your search already around May! Within Codarts there's no campus system. In the Netherlands students are responsible for their own housing.

STEP 4. Language proficiency

Dutch-language programmes

If you have a previous non-Dutch education and are planning to enrol for a Dutch-language programme, you will be required to pass the NT2-II state examination and send in your proof before 15 August, before the start of your studies. Registering for the exam is arranged via DUO. You need to arrange this yourself on time.

English-language programmes

To take part in an English-language bachelor's programme at Codarts, you must be in possession of an IELTS certificate (Academic level 5.5), a comparable TOEFL certificate or a comparable Cambridge FCE-C certificate. For an enrolment in a master's programme, you must hold at least an IELTS certificate (Academic level 6.0) or one of the above comparable certificates. If you cannot present a valid certificate or if you do not have an exemption, you must take part in the English test at Codarts.

The students below receive exemption from the English language requirement:

The student:

1. who has had prior training in the English language and has:
 - a. The European Baccalaureate with English as language of instruction and a pass mark for English;
 - b. the International Baccalaureate with English as the language of instruction and a pass mark in English;
2. who have completed a secondary or tertiary education (and obtained their diploma) in a country in which English is the official language of instruction (Australia, Canada, Ireland, New Zealand, United Kingdom and United States);
3. with a secondary school diploma (sufficient to enter a higher vocational education programme and a pass mark for the final exam subject English) from one of the following countries: Belgium (Flanders only), Denmark, Germany, Estonia, Finland, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Norway, Austria, Romania, Slovakia, Sweden.
4. who have obtained a mbo- level 4, havo or vwo diploma in the Netherlands. (NLQF4).

Please note: Codarts' ASC assesses whether the diploma obtained is sufficient to be exempted from the language requirement.

3. After arrival in the Netherlands

STEP 5. Residence permit

See in step 1 which requirements apply to you. Contact International Office within one week after arrival in the Netherlands. The International Office will let you know when your residence permit is ready for you and where you should pick it up. After you receive your residence permit card, make sure you make a scanned copy of both the front and back and send it to the Administrative Service Center via e-mail to asc@codarts.nl.

STEP 6. Dutch bank account

After you have found a place to live in the Netherlands, you can open a Dutch bank account for example at the ING bank (several places in centre of Rotterdam) or at the ABN AMRO bank: [Student Package - ABN AMRO](#). For opening a student bank account you need to provide the following:

- a proof of enrollment to Codarts (request via asc@codarts.nl);
- your passport;
- a Dutch address
- Burgerservicenummer (BSN) – social security number - (you will get it after registration at the municipality in the Netherlands)

Please notice that if you're under 18 years old, you need your parents or guardian with you to open a bank account.

STEP 7. Health insurance

Health insurance is mandatory in the Netherlands and is the student's own responsibility! If your health insurance is not arranged correctly, you may face **unexpectedly high medical costs.**

It is important to **check your insurance situation before coming to the Netherlands** and to review it again if your situation changes (for example, if you start working or a paid internship).

- Students (EU and non-EU/EEA) who have a paid job or a paid internship in the Netherlands are **legally required to take out Dutch public health insurance.**
This applies to all paid work, regardless of the number of hours or the type of contract.

- Non-EU/EEA students without a paid job or paid internship are not eligible for Dutch public health insurance and **must arrange private health insurance** themselves, valid from the date of arrival and covering medically necessary healthcare for the entire stay.

Recommended option for students without paid work

Codarts recommends **AON Student Insurance** as a commonly used and practical option.

This insurance:

- can be arranged online before arrival in the Netherlands;
- covers medically necessary healthcare in the Netherlands;
- can be taken out for the full duration of the stay;
- costs approximately €40–€60 per month, depending on coverage.

STEP 8. Registration at the city hall

If you will stay in the Netherlands for at least 4 months, you must register with the municipality where you will live

Required documents:

- passport;
- statement of enrolment from Codarts;
- copy of your residence permit (non-EU students);
- your rent contract or tenancy agreement (tenancy agreement form to get at Codarts international office) + photocopy of the landlord's passport.

Information about registration in the municipality Rotterdam, will be send to you in August by email.

Please note: To live in certain neighborhoods in Rotterdam you need a **housing permit** (HV). Read more on: <https://www.rotterdam.nl/loket/huisvestingsvergunning/>

STEP 9. Burgerservicenummer (BSN) – Social security number

After the registration in the City Hall you also receive your Burgerservicenummer (BSN) (social security number). Please see step 8 for the required documents. You will need this number to be able to open a Dutch bank account and in case you would like to work.

STEP 10. Work

You will receive your residence permit exclusively as a student, which means that you are not allowed to work regularly for money, except for students from most EU/EER-countries.

However: non-EU/EER-citizens can work *maximum 16 hours per week or* full time during the months June-July-August, and in all cases the employer needs to apply for a working permit through the Central Organisation for Work and Income (in Dutch: UWV). Working while studying means that you are **obligated** (by the Dutch law) to take out **basic health care insurance**.

Appendix Declaration of intent to undergo a TB test

In order to obtain a residence permit, you (or the person you represent) must be prepared to undergo a tuberculosis (TB) test and - if necessary -treatment. If you submit the completed declaration of intent to undergo a TB test to the IND together with your application (and also meet all other conditions), the IND will grant you a residence permit as soon as possible.

You are granted this permit under the express condition that you will actually undergo a TB test within three months after having received your residence permit. Should it become clear after the issue of a residence permit that - despite signing the declaration of intent - you failed to undergo a TB test within the period of three months, this may result in a cancellation of the permit that was granted.

Enclose the completed and signed declaration of intent with your application before you make an appointment with the Municipal Health Service. In doing so, you declare that you are prepared to undergo a TB test and, if necessary, TB treatment. For the appointment with the Municipal Health Service, you must complete the referral form as much as possible (part 1) and take it with you.

The obligation to undergo the test does not apply if you are a national of one of the countries listed in the appendix 'Exemption from the obligation to undergo a tuberculosis (TB) test'. Nor does the obligation to undergo the test apply if you have an EU residence permit for long-term residents issued by another EU country or are his/her family member and were already admitted to another EU country as a family member of the long-term resident.

- You must not constitute a risk to a public order.
- If your nationality requires this, you must be prepared to undergo a medical inspection for tuberculosis.

Attachment 6. Explanation of the required financial documents for the residence permit application

The IND has very strict guidelines for the proof of financial means. It is very important that you follow these guidelines exactly, otherwise your application may be denied, or at the very least seriously delayed.

Required amount per month
Preparatory year: € 1130,77 (excluding tuition fee)
Exchange students / € 1130,77 Erasmus program:
Regular full-time students: € 1130,77 (excluding tuition fee)

You need to show that you will have a minimum amount of € 1130,77 every month for living expenses (please note: this amount is excluding the tuition fee and the immigration fee). There are several ways to prove sufficient means for costs of living in the Netherlands, depending on your financial situation. All documents must be drawn up in Dutch, English, German or French. The educational institution has to keep all records.

The student has sufficient financial means on her/his own bank account.
If you can show proof of sufficient financial means on your own, there are two options:

1. Money in your own bank account

There are two options to show sufficient financial means on your own:

1. you transfer €15.000 to the Codarts bank account. The Codarts bank account information can be found on page 10 of this document.
The legal costs for immigration are €254. After you arrival you will receive the rest of your money back on your Dutch bank account, once you have one.
2. The standard amount is in your own bank account. This bank account is in your name. You can withdraw the money from the bank account free of charge. You have, for example, a current account or a regular savings account that allows you to withdraw cash. Do you have a different type of account? Please show that the balance can be withdrawn free of charge. Certificates of deposit are only accepted when they indicate that you may and can withdraw the money.

Do you have a joint account holder? A statement is then required. This statement indicates that you may and can use the money.

You need one of the following documents:

- ✓ An original bank statement. This bank statement is not older than 3 months. The bank statement shows:
 - the date;
 - your personal details (at least your initials and surname);
 - the bank account number;

- the balance;
- the contact details of the bank (website/email, bank branch including address and telephone number).
- ✓ A copy of an account statement. This copy is not older than 3 months. The copy shows:
 - the date;
 - your personal details (at least your initials and surname);
 - the bank account number;
 - the balance;
 - the contact details of the bank (website/email, bank branch including address and telephone number).
- ✓ A printout of the internet of the bank account. This printout is not older than 3 months. Do you have a printout of a foreign bank account? You also need an original bank statement.

The printout shows:

- the date;
- your personal details (at least your initials and surname);
- your address;
- the balance.

2. Scholarship

Do you have a scholarship? Please show you have sufficient financial means to study and live in the Netherlands by submitting:

- ✓ A scholarship declaration.

The declaration shows:

- the date;
- the institution granting the scholarship;
- your personal details (initials, surname and date of birth)
- the start and finish of the scholarship (start and end date);
- the amount you receive;
- Optional: the name of the scholarship programme.

Does the educational institution grant you a scholarship on behalf of a different institution? For example an organisation or company? Please then show the agreement between your educational institution and the institution in question.

Deposit money on the account of your educational institution

You can also deposit the standard amount on the bank account of your educational institution.

You can demonstrate having done this by submitting:

- a copy of an account statement of the educational institution. The account statement shows:
 - the date;
 - the bank account number and name of the educational institution;
 - the amount paid. The copy shows that the amount paid is connected to you. You have, for example, included your name and student number in the transaction. There is no handwritten text allowed on the copy. The amount is on the account upon submitting the application or enrolment.

3. Financier abroad

Someone abroad funds your study and stay. The full amount of the financier's support is available upon submitting the application. Your financier has this amount available for the duration of the financial support (at least the first year).

You need:

- ✓ An original statement of financial support. This statement is not older than 3 months. [appendix_study_privateperson.pdf \(ind.nl\)](#).
 - A copy of the passport or identity document of the financier.
 - One of the following documents:
- ✓ An original bank statement in the name of the financier. This statement is not older than 3 months. The bank statement shows:
 - the date;
 - the personal details of the financier (at least the initials and surname);
 - the bank account number;
 - the balance;
 - the contact details of the bank (website/email, bank branch including address and telephone number).

Your financier can withdraw the money from the bank account free of charge. Your financier has, for example, a current account or a regular savings account that allows him to withdraw cash. Does your financier have a different type of account? Please show that the balance can be withdrawn free of charge.

Does your financier have a joint account holder? A statement is then required.

This statement indicates that your financier may and can use the money.

4. Financier in the Netherlands

Someone in the Netherlands funds your study and stay. Your financier in the Netherlands has an income that at least meets the income requirement for students as well as the income requirement applicable to the financier. The family composition of the financier determines the amount of the income requirement applicable to the financier. You need:

One of the following documents. Depending on the situation of your financier:

Your financier works in employment:

- ✓ a copy of an employment contract, showing:
 - the name and address of the employer;
 - the personal details of the financier (initials, surname, date of birth);
 - type of employment contract (temporary or permanent).
 - ✓ an original employer's statement. This statement is not older than 3 months. The statement shows:
 - the name and address of the employer;
 - the personal details of your financier (initials, surname, date of birth);
 - type of employment contract (temporary or permanent).
 - ✓ Copies of the salary statements (payslips) of your financier of the past three months. The salary statement shows:
 - the name and address of the employer;
 - the personal details of your financier (initials, surname, date of birth);
 - the period the salary payment covers;
 - the net salary amount.

Your financier works as a self-employed person:

- ✓ (A copy of) an extract of the Commercial Register of the Chamber of Commerce. The extract (or copy) is not older than 3 months.
- ✓ An original declaration on income of self-employed person. The declaration is not older than 3 months.
- ✓ A copy of the (provisional income tax assessment) IB/IB60 of the preceding calendar year.

5. You receive funds from a company

You receive financial support from a company to fund your study and stay in the Netherlands.

You need:

- ✓ A statement of financial support. This statement is not older than 3 months. You can make use of the Appendix 'Financial statement of support (company)'. Contact International Office from Codarts for this form

- ✓ An original bank statement of the company. This bank statement is not older than 3 months. The bank statement shows:
 - the name of the company;
 - the bank account number;
 - the balance;
 - the contact details of the bank (website/email and bank branch).

The company can withdraw the money from the bank account free of charge. The company, for example, has a current account or a regular savings account that allows for cash to be withdrawn. Does the company have a different type of account? Please show that the balance can be withdrawn free of charge.
